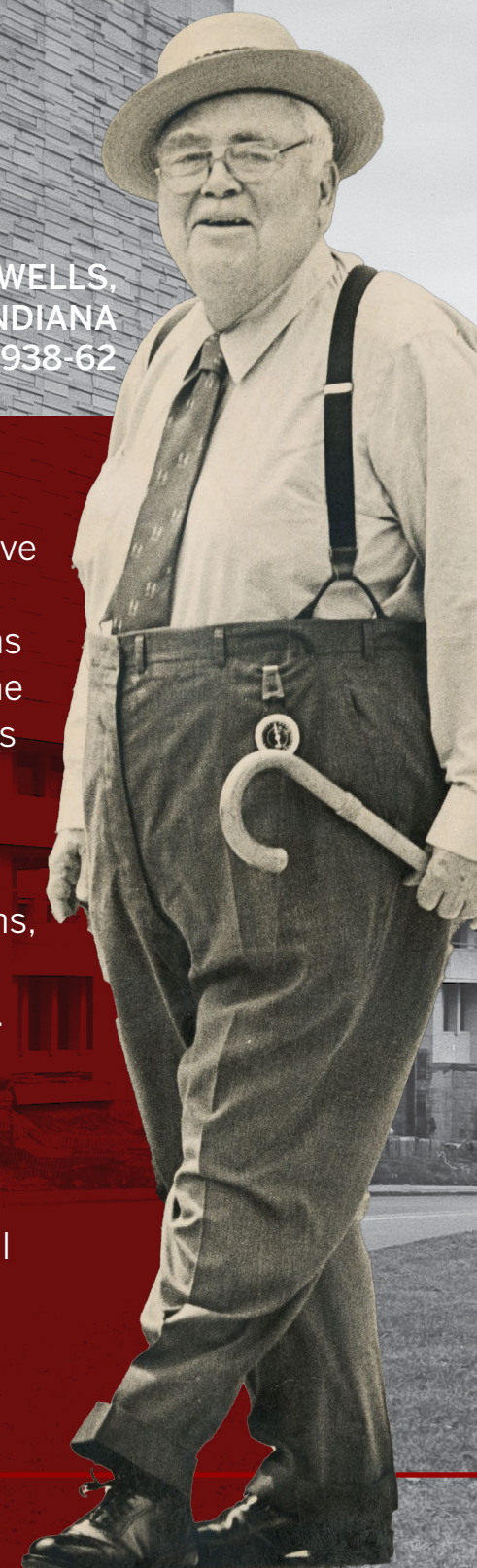

Welcome to Bloomington Indiana, home to the flagship campus of Indiana University and to IU Libraries. We serve 48,000 undergraduates, 10,000 graduate students and more than 125 research centers, institutes, and museums here in Bloomington. Our library destinations include one of the world's great libraries – the Lilly Library– as well as Wylie House Museum, one of the country's only historic house museums operated by a library. The Herman B Wells Library is at the center of campus life and our landmark facility and offers access to our print collections, Library Administration, University Archives, Moving Image Archive and hundreds of reservable study spaces. The Auxiliary Library Facility is our modern and secure climate-controlled book and object repository operated by IU Libraries to support many campus collections and units. Additional library destinations include the William and Gayle Cook Music Library and Archives of Traditional Music (ATM), Business/SPEA Library, Sciences Library, Education Library, and Neal-Marshall Black Culture Center Library.
